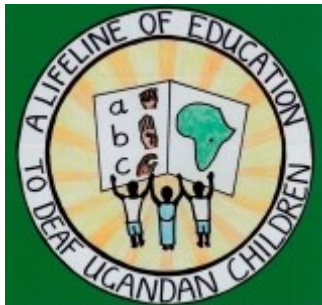

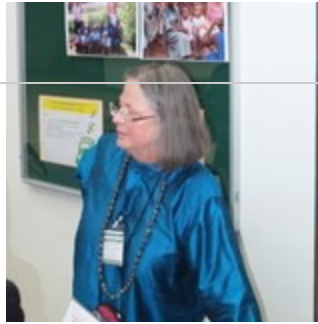
Visiting Uganda
